My dear Mr. Williams,

On April 25, we sent you a copy of a letter addressed to Holabird & Root concerning the colors of carpets and leather for some of the special rooms. We have a reply from Holabird & Root this morning and are now giving you the following schedule:

1. The large and small board rooms are to be carpeted in No. 23 Cafe Au Lait Amaxim quality manufactured by The Firth Carpet Company, 295 Fifth Avenue, New York.
2. The Administrator's office is to be carpeted in No. 12 Amaxim quality Moonstone Taupe as manufactured by the Firth Carpet Company, 295 Fifth Avenue, New York.

Samples of the above carpet were loaned by Mr. Siegriest and should be returned to him.

3. All other rooms where carpets are to be used shall be covered in No. C-783 Beaver Taupe Claridge as manufactured by Alexander Smith. This is available from W. & J. Sloane under a Procurement contract. The sample we are sending you, you may retain.
4. The leather for the chairs for the large board room and for the small board room, if they are ordered, should be MC-7-A - brown and the furniture finished according to the walnut sample which together with the samples of leather should be returned to Mr. Clarke of the Procurement Division.
5. If any furniture is purchased for the Directors' Rooms or other executive offices, it should be of the same standard walnut color and the leather covering, if any, also should be MC-7-A.
